On Monday 9 April, housing association Moat, currently located in the offices of Maldon District Council, is moving to new premises at Fullbridge Mill in Maldon. The new and bigger office will provide extra space for the expanded neighbourhood team and also accommodate a community hub for customers, run by Moat Foundation (Moat's charitable arm). This will be the fifth of Moat's community hubs, and will provide a wider range of targeted services and projects to support the local community, with focussed programmes and projects designed to assist social and economic regeneration.
